March Monthly Meeting

What a fabulous meeting we had in March where members shared about books or websites that held special interest for them.

Jim MacDougall started by sharing a photo he had seen many years ago in a book owned by his father. It was of five Masters of ships from Nova Scotia who were all in Newcastle at the same time in 1904. Two of these Masters are related to Jim. The book is an academic study of the working conditions of men on ships, and Jim noted it is in the Dalhousie University Archives, Halifax, Nova Scotia. A full story on this is in our Journal No 237.

Marie Hughes shared two books by Grace Karskens describing the early history of Sydney and surrounds which gave Marie a great appreciation for the areas resided in by her ancestors. The books are fascinating, well-researched and well-written. *The Colony: A History of Early Sydney* (2009) and *People of the River: Lost Worlds of Early Australia* (2020).

Kirstie Carrick followed on with a book by Anna Blair, *Miss Cranston's Omnibus: Recollections of Glasgow Life* (1985 and 1991). Anna interviewed elderly Glaswegians in the 1970's and recorded their special memories giving a wealth of information on housing and the people who lived in the houses. A great way to get an idea of what life was like in Glasgow in the early 1900's.

Margaret Ashford spoke of three pieces of writing by her grandfather which illustrated how fascinating information can be gleaned in odd places like scrappy notebooks that could easily have been discarded. These books told the full story of how her grandparents' house had been financed, every payment made for the house, how many fires had been lit in the stove and many more interesting pieces of family information.

Mel Woodford wrapped up the evening by talking about the wonderful resources available on the University of Newcastle's website: Hunter Living Histories <https://hunterlivinghistories.com/>. She then showed the start of an interesting video well worth viewing: *LYCETT & WALLIS: Unlikely Preservers of Aboriginal Knowledge*, <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Ktcu06sy3b0>

Covid update and Duty of Care

Covid update

You will need to sign in with your membership number, name, time of arrival and phone number. You will need to sign out when leaving. Your temperature will be checked. Be prepared for limited numbers in the building. All computers will be in use. You must wear a face mask at all times whilst in the building.

As the Delta and Omicron forms of the virus are aerosols, doors will have to remain open to create a draft to allow through ventilation and the upright fans will be used to ventilate the computer area.

Any food and drinks should be consumed outside.

Cleaning of all surfaces will need to be done after each user. All books, CDs, maps, etc will need to be quarantined after use for 48 hours.

Remember you can always borrow books in person or via click and collect.

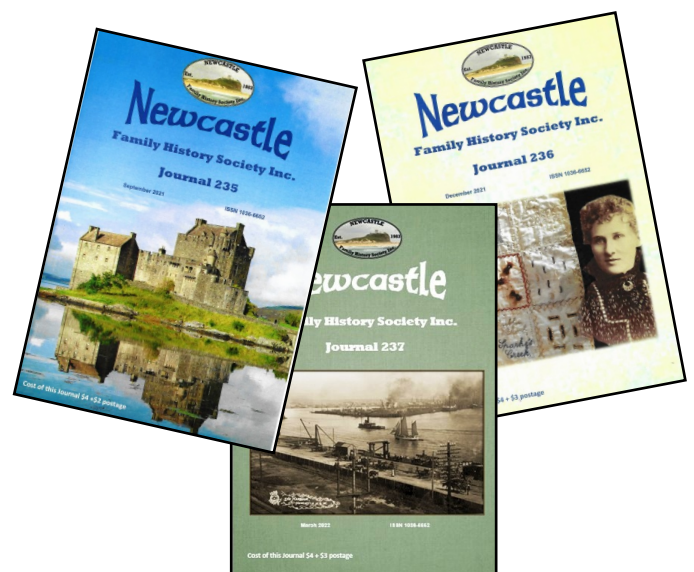

Rookwood Cemetery Friday 6 May 2022

Friday, 6 May, we will travel to Rookwood Cemetery and will be met by a guide for a tour of the cemetery. Each participant is asked to bring a donation of \$20 for the Friends of Rookwood Cemetery for the upkeep of the Cemetery.

We will meet at the Rookwood Cafe at 9.30am for coffee or tea. Breakfast can be ordered if needed. Turn right off Centenary Drive into Weeroona Rd and enter Rookwood Cemetery. The cafe car park is the first on the left.

The tour will focus on Ships and Shipwrecks. In the 19th Century, hundreds of thousands of convicts and immigrants made the always hazardous voyage at a time when an average of one ship a week was lost in Australian waters. Well into the 20th century, ocean travel was the only way in and out of Australia. Headstones at Rookwood bring to mind some of those journeys and disasters.

Names of the famous and less-known wrecks are recorded on many family monuments.

Hear too, about the early years of the Australian Navy and the Sydney Squadron of the Royal Navy on the Australia Station.

To enable private research, both the General Cemetery and the Catholic Cemetery have online deceased search engines and staff can be contacted to answer your questions regarding family and friends' grave sites, maps, etc.

We will have lunch at the cafe. Also, the place to pick up a coffee before the tour. We will meet at the cafe at 9.30am and later at 12.30pm for lunch.

The Sydney War Cemetery and Garden of Remembrance are situated next to the cafe and well worth a visit. The Books of Remembrance are available to look up a loved one.

We will leave for Newcastle no later than 2.30pm for our trip home.

This is a self-drive tour and will be held unless it is raining cats and dogs. I will post on NFHS Facebook page if cancelled by 7.00am on the day.

Tour of Newcastle War Cemetery – a Hidden Gem Sunday 24 April 2022

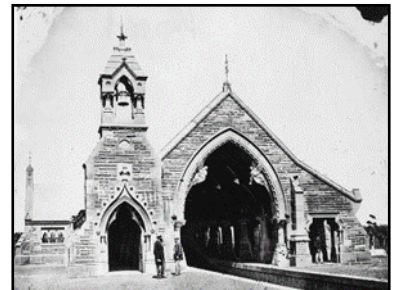

The Pam Files

Our Pamphlet Files provide a gold mine of information that many of our members overlook. These are housed in filing cabinets and located on your left as you enter the back room. The contents are in three main groups: Local History, Surnames and Miscellaneous. But how do you find out what's in them?

If you are looking for a person or family, go to the Surname Index – the card file index found near the kitchen. It contains many thousands of entries, indexed by surname and each card leads you to a source of information about the person or family whose name is on the card. You may be directed to a folder in the Pam File, a book in the library, a research report, or some other location. Please note that this might be the only way you could find the item that you need.

If you are searching for a subject (German immigration, adoption records, Scottish clans, whaling industry, etc) then look in the Subject Index. This index is installed on all the computers as a searchable pdf file. Like the Surname index, you can be directed to the Pam File, a book, a Journal or to some other resource. But again, it is the only way for you to locate many of the items in the Pam Files.

We are continually adding items to the Pam Files, and updating the Surname Index and the Subject Index accordingly so you can find them. Next time you are in the library, take a closer look at this priceless resource.
