August General Meeting

Our August monthly meeting, attended by 16 on Zoom, was extremely interesting. Janis Wilton, Adjunct Associate Professor in History at the University of New England, and her husband Joe Eisenberg, Emeritus Cultural Director of the Maitland Regional Art Gallery, presented a fascinating overview of the Maitland Jewish Cemetery. Most of the attendees admitted to knowing nothing or very little about this cemetery (myself included).

Maitland Jewish Cemetery, being the most intact dedicated Jewish cemetery in NSW, was founded in 1846 with the first burials in 1849, with 55 identified burials between 1849 and 1934 and one burial 76 years later in 2010 of Leah Abadee, a centenarian who expressed her desire to Rabbi Mendel Kastel that she wished to be buried with her family named Lewis. The headstones feature Hebrew inscriptions along with some English (although the English translation doesn't have as much information as the Hebrew).

We learnt of some Jewish burial customs: burial must be within 24 hours; the cemetery needs to be outside the city; for a burial or other official Jewish service, a minyan (or quorum) of 10 men 13 years of age or older must be present to recite the kaddish prayer; most headstones are very similar as all people are considered equal.

Janis and Joe first encountered the cemetery when Joe, born in Israel, became Emeritus Cultural Director at the Maitland Regional Art Gallery. For many years since 1934, the cemetery had been extremely neglected. In 1978 a working bee was held and the cemetery was reconsecrated in August 1979 before being taken into the care of Maitland City Council in 1989. In the 1990s another huge clean up was carried out where many of the headstones were found basically buried. The headstones in the cemetery are made of fine sandstone, most probably from the Ravensfield Colliery.

In 2014 the cemetery was closed and listed on the State Heritage Register. A huge amount of conservation work, landscaping and maintenance has been carried out including fencing the cemetery.

Janis and Joe then told us about some of the people who are buried at Maitland. There are a variety of birthplaces; convicts and descendants of convicts; babies, children and young adults; intramarriage; practising Jews; criminals; rich and poor; people active in local and Jewish communities. Some of the families buried there include Cohen, Levi, Freidman, Goulston.

Thank you so much to Janis and Joe who took the time to present to us via Zoom from Canberra. We thoroughly enjoyed your presentation and learnt so much. I would encourage members to visit the cemetery next time you are in the area. It is located at 112-114 Louth Park Road, South Maitland.

Covid update and Duty of Care

Covid update

You will need to sign in with your membership number, name, time of arrival and phone number and sign out when leaving. Your temperature will be checked. Be prepared for limited numbers in the building and all computers will be in use. You must wear a face mask while in the building.

If the temperature in the rooms warrants it, close the doors and turn on the AC. Please turn off when you leave the room. A face mask must be worn in air-conditioned areas.

You will need to wear a mask at all times and any food and drinks should be consumed outside.

Cleaning of all surfaces will need to done after each user. All books, CDs, maps, etc will need to be quarantined after use for 48 hours.

We aim to maintain as healthy an environment as possible at the NFHS rooms and all are welcome to attend. Remember to wear your mask at all times and socially distance. If you are still hesitant, wear an N95 mask or wear two masks to safeguard yourself from the aerosol droplets.

If you are unwell, then please stay at home until you are well. Organise click and collect to continue your research from home and have a friend collect the books for you.


Rookwood Cemetery Friday 2 September 2022—10.00am







Rabbi Yossi Rodal and Malki Rodal and their family came to Newcastle in 2020 as the first rabbi here after 60 years without one. He now covers Newcastle and the Central Coast. There was an article in the local paper about them at the time and I think I even put it in the PAM files!


New publication


