War Cemetery Tour – Quarterly Report September 2022

The planned War Cemetery Tour at Sandgate was held on Sunday August 14th 2022.

The tour was the initiative of Ed Tonks OAM as a gesture of appreciation for assistance from the Society in the past.

It was very successful despite less-than-ideal weather conditions, with 32 attending. More had registered but illness caused a significant number to cancel during the last couple of days and even on the day. Six volunteers were involved, with our numbers also being reduced because of illness.

A few participants were Society members, the remainder were people who had left their contact details at Sandgate General Cemetery tours, plus family and friends. This follow up by the group representing the Society was greatly appreciated, with many reminders to keep these names on the lists for future tours.

Visitors received a lovely sprig of rosemary tied with two ribbons in colours representing the medal ribbons for Forces members who had served in the Pacific War; they were created by Maree Shilling. Their 'goodies' bags a brochure about the War Cemetery created by Ken and Maree Shilling, a Society brochure, a Society publications flyer and order form, a Society membership form and a brochure about Ed Tonks' publications. Many of those who were forced to cancel expressed disappointment so as a gesture of good will they have been sent an emailed copy of the one-page brochure, for their information.

On display was a double-sided board displaying illustrations of the many aircraft that had been involved in the lives and deaths of so many RAAF personnel buried in the cemetery. This generated a lot of interest and discussion.

Notable attendees were the grandson of one of the men interred in the Cemetery and a 98-year-old WWII veteran who had served in the New Guinea campaigns, the father of a member.

St John's Ambulance provided their services for the day and were presented with a donation of \$100 gathered from visitors and volunteers.

We were delighted with the response and it was an excellent way to promote the Society and the Cemetery. In turn we received donations of resources – Ed Tonks' research on the Cemetery and those interred, which will be bound and added to the Society's collection of Cemetery listings; resources for a story in *They Served Their Country*, which will be of greater interest than perhaps is usual, as the family is of Chinese-Australian descent.

Letters of thanks went to Ed Tonks for his initiative, research and wonderful talks; DVA/CWGC for permission to conduct the tours and enthusiasm for the event; St John's Ambulance for First Aid services gratis; Northern Cemeteries for parking and verbal support; and Iain MacDougall for transporting and erecting equipment.
