Our June meeting will feature member Julie Keating speaking on the Australian Agricultural Company (AA Co). I'm sure many members will find this subject extremely interesting.

Next year the AA Co will celebrate two hundred years since it was set up to invest in the New South Wales Colony. Its aim was to improve the quality of merino wool and the company received a grant of 500,000 acres of land centred on the Port Stephens area. This land was not suitable for wool growing and other crops were tested. Once again this venture was not successful and the company swapped part of the initial grant for land further west.

The government had been using convicts to mine coal and was under increasing pressure to run the mines on a more efficient and sustainable basis. It negotiated with the AA Co to have a monopoly on coal mining in the area for a period of 30 years. Part of this agreement was that the company was given 2,000 acres stretching from Crown St westwards.

The company is no longer involved in mining and wool production. Today it is the largest cattle and beef producer in the country and its land holdings, mainly in the Northern Territory, account for 1% of Australia's landmass. According to the company's website more than one million people consume its product each day.




