Jan lives in Lake Macquarie and holds a PhD in History from the University of Newcastle. Her first book, Shadows On The Track: Australia's


Medical War in Papua 1942-1943 was published in 2019 as part of the Australian Army History Collection.


Jan's most recent book, *All The Broken Soldiers: Private Kennedy's War* was released in November 2022.




Sales of our Publications helps pay our expenses. We make more than we spend but to do that we need to keep producing information.


Not meeting in August

One recent donation from a community member virtually left us speechless - it was the attendance book from the Lambton Mechanics and Miners Institute dating from July 19, 1885. The Institute's new building on Howe Street housed the library and in 1885 it was decided to open it every Sunday for members to use. The book contains the signatures of the members attending on each Sunday. None of us knew such a book existed until it was given to us. The donor didn't know who was responsible for keeping the book for so many years.

Shown here are the first two pages of the book. The number of people attending proves how popular the library was with members. In 1903 the building was moved to the back of our 'new' (built in 1894) building on Elder Street and is part of our library.

We will put the book on display in the rare book cabinet in the front office.



To acknowledge the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War, the Department of Veterans' Affairs will produce a Commemorative Medallion and Certificate of Commemoration.
