Congratulations to all who contributed to the success of wood raffle. The proceeds amounted to just under \$4,000. That with \$720 raised from the Fossil Fossicks outings certainly boosted the bank balance though there is little respite when you consider our anticipated outgoings.

We held our May meeting at the museum for members to re-acquaint themselves with the museum and all it entails. It takes quite an effort from the committee and the guides to keep it open and to showcase our history.

With the support of Mayor Allan McGrath, Life Member Dr Richard Reid, Wayne Doubleday, Manager, Regional Archives, Charles Sturt University, Wagga Wagga and Ross Webster, President of the Yass Soldiers Club we submitted an application for a Community Heritage Grant available through the National Library of Australia. If successful it will allow us to engage a professional archivist to confirm the cultural heritage value of the archival collection. by undertaking a significance assessment. What became increasingly apparent while working on the application is the enormity of what we hold, its incredible range of themes and its importance not only to Yass Valley but the nation.

Local member Wendy Tuckerman continues to work on our behalf and is following up the possibility of accom-

modation for the archives at the local court house. Enquiries have also been made through Property NSW.

We are exploring how we might engage with current members and prospective members who are unable to attend weekday meetings due to work and other commitments. This could be done by Zoom or Team Meetings online or alternating afternoon and evening meetings.

Our Treasurer Tanya Cullen hosts a Tuesday morning session on local radio and we will be bringing you some interesting local history segments in the near future. We also thank her for taking over the editing of *Boongaroon* now that our long time proof reader Anne Pigram has settled into her new life in Bargo.

We will shortly host a visit by the committee of the Braidwood Historical Society who are keen to see our museum and archives. They are in the process of a multi-million dollar renovation and redevelopment of their museum site and it will be interesting to discuss how they went about the process.
