It is the Group's policy that we do not commence research until the applicable fee is received. Only a search of the resources held by the Young & District Family History Group Inc. will be undertaken.

**COST:** An initial **\$10.00** non-refundable search fee is required with your FIRST enquiry before any investigation will be conducted.

**COST:** A further **\$30.00** research fee per family name (e.g.: Mr & Mrs Smith and children, "Smith" being the family name) is required should the initial request uncover a considerable amount of information, or the request is complex.

**MEETINGS:** Meetings and special events will be advised by email to all financial members.

**GENERAL:** Members requesting information from the Group's Library are reminded that the Research Monitors work on a voluntary basis and can only provide information from the resources available.

### The Way Ahead: Local and Community Histories for our Future Wagga RSL 21-22 October 2023.



Should be an opportunity to learn and socialise with others who have similar interests.


