POLISH CANE-CUTTERS ARRIVE

30th August Bundaberg News Mail

Brisbane Sunday – Fifty-four Poles, who will help with the sugar harvest in North Queensland arrive in Brisbane this week.

Announcing this today, the General Secretary of the ASPA (Mr E T Pearce) said that the Poles had been engaged in cane-cutting and would form six gangs. Nine of the men would go to the Cairns district, 18 to Innisfail and 27 to Tully. They leave Brisbane for the north on Wednesday.

Mr Pearce said “The employment of immigrant as cane-cutters had had a major influence on the improved labour conditions in the sugar industry this year. Without their assistance, most of the far northern district would have been harvesting at a rate well below that necessary to crush the greater tonnages of cane available. As it is cane suppliers are still unsatisfactory in a number of areas.

CEREMONY PLANS

Ceremony Plan for Nurses Memorial Park (Bundaberg News Mail 2nd September 1948)

Construction of the War Nurses memorial Park at West Bundaberg has reached a stage where plans are being considered by the West Bundaberg Progress association for a ceremony officially to hand the park over to the control of the City Council.

The President (Mr G McBride) reporting on progress to the monthly meeting of the Association, last night, invited suggestions from members on the form of the ceremony, which it is hoped will take place in a couple of months.

He asked them to give full consideration to the proposal and bring their suggestions to the next meeting in October.

EXTRACTS FROM MOUNT PERRY STATE SCHOOL CENTENARY 1871-1971

Church History

Wesleyan – The Rev J F Orr was the only settled minister in Mt Perry by 1874

Catholic Mt Perry was made a separate parish in 1874. Father Rossalini was the first priest. He visited Mt Perry from Bundaberg – at times – on foot. Later there was a resident priest who also looked after Gin Gin. Currently the Church is administered from Gin Gin and the Parish priest is Rev F R Brian Cooper.

Methodist The Rev W H Williams was appointed in 1876. This Church was opposite the New Court House (Shire Hall) closed down in 1877. Currently the congregation utilize the

Presbyterian Church and are looked after by Bundaberg.

Church of England Dedicated July 16th, 1903 by Rev Nathaniel Dawes, Bishop of Rockhampton. In the early days this church community was served by the Bush Brotherhood with headquarters in Gayndah. Currently the parishioners are looked after by Rev G H Taylor, Minister in charge of Gin Gin and District Parish.

Presbyterian Dedicated on 17th June 1908. Officiating Ministers were Rev A Gillison and Rev H C Hulme. The total cost of the building and furniture was £230.

Schools in Mount Perry

On October 7th, 1871, First Provisional School opened with 36 pupils. The Headmaster was Archibald Douglas. The building was made of bark and was situated between what is now Miss Searle's Residence in Heusman St and Smelter (Copper) Ck. On the adjacent was the then Tenningering Court House, later Shire Office.

Pupils known to have attended the school in 1871 are Harriett Church, Tottie Clark, Harriett Blundell, J Town and the Quinn children. A 1941 Bundaberg Newspaper Report states that the records of the Provisional School 1871-1874 "were destroyed some years ago". One of the other teachers at the time was Pat McCartney.

Other Schools

Harper's Hill The school at Harper's Hill occupied two different sites in its period of existence. It was closed in about 1919 or 1920 and was bought by Mr E J Dingle and converted into a dwelling.

Towns Creek (also called Log Hole) was originally in an old house owned by Alf Smith around 1920. The teacher was Miss May Broadhurst. It was later erected on the Monto Road over the range about 100 yards from the advertising sign on the hill. Miss M Searle taught here. Among the pupils were Royce Zimmer who attended both schools when they started also Herb Clarey.

Drummers Creek Commenced before the turn of the century and closed in 1958. Among the teachers were Gertrude Bendell in the 1890's. Others included Nellie Elworthy, May Broadhurst, Ruby Renfrey, Bob McPherson, Arch Dixon, Kate Ludwig and Miss M Searle. The buildings are still intact. They were purchased by Mr Bill Madsen and now owned by Arthur Dingle Jnr.

Reid's Creek On the Reid's Creek goldfield. The teacher was a Miss Hendricks.

Birth record gives important details on family's WWII escape from the Soviet Union

I have been impatiently waiting for my mother's birth record to arrive at the city archive for Kyiv. The record still hasn't arrived at the archive but I got the record this week for free without a hassle.

Ukrainian birth, marriage and death records become public record after 75 years. I assumed that if the records weren't at the archives, the records weren't available to the public. Wrong.

Had I known this, I could have gotten my mother's birth record 6 years ago. All the waiting has resulted in getting the birth record from the WWII era during another war in Ukraine.

My contact in Kyiv filled out a simple form and got the record on a photocopy the same day. I knew when my phone started dinging at 4:30 a.m. my contact was in the registry office. Thankfully, I also did the math for when my great-grandfather died to confirm 75 years had passed and his death record arrived in my email with my mother's birth record from my contact.

My mother only just saw her original birth record. It's a family mystery where her birth record went since she left Kyiv in 1943 as a baby and it's a miracle the record hasn't been destroyed during this war.

A few pieces of information on her birth record helps me complete the story of my mother's escape out of Soviet Ukraine with her parents and maternal grandparents, aunt and uncle.

Her parents are listed as Volksdeutsche, people of German ancestry living outside of Germany. My grandfather's parents were both Russian but my grandmother was half German from her mother and half Russian from her father. Noting both my grandparents as Volksdeutsche shows, I believe, that the Ukrainian government knew of my family's plans to leave Ukraine or had marked them as Volksdeutsche to make them feel unwelcome in the city occupied by the Germans.

The birth record also lists the address of my grandparents, the apartment next to my maternal great-grandparents. I thought my grandparents were registered at another address six months earlier but a search on Google led me to a Wikipedia page that shows the street also was known by another name.

My mother's birth record also identifies my grandfather as a construction engineer employed in a sculpture's workshop and my grandparents' marriage record number. Seeing the notation of

the marriage record shows the importance of getting all possible records when struggling to find information.

My contact wasn't surprised my mother's birth record and great-grandfather's death record were still sitting in the registry office. If the city archive in Kyiv had enough room to store these records, he said, they would have been moved years ago.

This is going to be the reality for many registry offices throughout Ukraine, not just Kyiv. When the Ukrainian government built these archives, they also were not thinking of foreigners and their citizens requesting records to work on their family trees.

This latest adventure started about two months ago when I annoyingly again contacted the city archive in Kyiv, asking if it had received birth records from 1942. The archive said not yet and offered the email address of the registry office, but I knew I couldn't get the record by email from the registry office.

I found an email address for an office that could officially clarify the process for obtaining my mother's birth record. An employee informed me that any Ukrainian citizen (read genealogy researchers, relatives or friends) can obtain my mother's birth record from the registry office.

Now if I attempted to get the record on my own, I would have been directed to contact a consulate general/consular office and most likely asked to pay a fee.

It's amazing that Ukraine has opened up this much for records. It was just 10 years ago that I could only get an extraction of an 1890 marriage record sitting in a registry office in eastern Ukraine.

What's even crazier is that my family tree from the former USSR goes back to the 1500s on some lines but I have another 12 years of waiting to see my deceased father's birth record from Russia.

Extracted from NSW Collections

We're delighted to announce that our partner Ancestry has digitised, indexed and published an important set of 19th-century NSW immigration records held in the State Archives Collection. The database is titled **New South Wales, Australia, Immigration Records, 1840–1902**.

These previously undigitised records provide a remarkable range of information beyond traditional shipping lists, about immigrants and the schemes under which they emigrated.

Key indexed series included in this suite are:

- **NRS 5274** Wages paid to orphans, 1849–51
- **NRS 5324** Persons authorised to import migrants, 1838–42
- **NRS 5243** Applications from persons in the colony nominating immigrants, 1857–58, 1880, 1885–95

In addition a number of non-indexed, browsable series are included:

- **NRS 5328** Ships' papers, 1839–91
- **NRS 5250** Copies of letters sent to public officers re migration to NSW, 1841–02

Digitisation increasingly plays a key role in both the preservation of and access to the State Archives Collection. Our partnership with Ancestry is central to furthering this work and we're so pleased to bring these records to a worldwide audience.

More probate packets added!

The Supreme Court of NSW has just transferred more than 23,000 probate packets into the State Archives Collection. These are for probates that were granted in the years 1978 and 1979, and they are now listed in the **State Archives catalogue**. You can narrow down your search by the name of the deceased or by date.

Probate packets are one of our most heavily used record series for family historians. We hold them for the years 1817–76, 1978–79 and 1989. Records in a probate packet include:

- the last will and testament of the deceased
- codicils (additions or revocations to the will)
- letters of administration
