President's Message

Hello again,

Our situation this time last year was not encouraging but through some incredible achievements we are now in a very different place.

A lot of hard work by the committee and members, grant applications, donations, and our own fundraising sees us well on the way to achieving our goal. The space at the museum that once housed our wool, church, Hume and Shearsby displays is being transformed to house the archives collection and provide a workspace for the volunteers who care for the collection. It will remain a large single room that will allow us to rearrange storage and furniture as our needs change and they undoubtedly will over time.

There is another dimension to this large project that should not be forgotten and that is the cooperation of local tradesmen who are undertaking the work and the volunteers of the Yass Antique Farm Machinery Club who dismantled the previous display infrastructure. The floor and exterior walls have had waterproofing installed with preliminary air conditioning and electrical wiring now in place. The walls and ceiling have been framed and as I write the insulation and gyprock is being installed. The next couple of weeks will be exciting as we complete this major work. But there will still be a long list of tasks to be tackled before we can move in.

It was with sincere regret that we received the resignation of Tanya Cullen our Vice-President who is not able to continue as a committee member due to increasing commitments elsewhere and we wish her well. I value her contribution to the committee particularly as we

negotiated the many obstacles we have faced in the past year. Tanya's knowledge and advice will be missed but she assures us she will continue to support the society wherever possible.

We are taking another step forward as we update our aging telecommunications to 5g. This is necessary due to the discontinued 3g network and our increasing demands upon data delivery to handle the business of the society. As a not -for-profit organisation we have been able to negotiate free use of Microsoft Office and Adobe products and reduced charges for an online accounting package that will reduce the work for our Treasurer Jason Harrop. These are small but important savings in money and volunteers' time.

A new quotation for the significance assessment of our collections has been received from Christine Yeats, our preferred assessor. We will be applying for funding from the Bango Wind Farm Community Enhancement to facilitate the assessment.
