- 2. All books are with the librarian to accession and put on the shelves.

## Minmi Cemetery (Revised Version) (Ros Cheetham)

- Database is complete up to the letter 'N'. Jane to allocate out letters O-Z so Ros can recommence.
- Ros has been using the Australian Cemetery Index and Trove to help with cross referencing. Each letter has a file created for any queries that may appear and to be corrected at a later date. All correct information is on the database as well as the excel spreadsheet.
- Currently on hold but can progress with O-Z.

## Minmi Cemetery (Revised Version) (Jane Ison)

• Jane to follow up with Robyn Jeffriess and Pat Healion to find out if they are able to continue with the history section of the cemetery as Jane and Ros only took on the database.

# Catherine Hill Bay Cemetery (Revised Version) (Ros Cheetham)

- The review was started after looking at Cemetery Map. An updated map was received from the council.
- I have been in contact with Laraine Nelson who carried out a Cemeteries Conservation Management Plan. Some very interesting reading of the cemetery also giving an insight into the burials.
- New photos are currently being taken providing a photo of new and old headstones/burials. (I believe there is a folder with negatives this also might also want to be looked at, to preserve.) Once weather conditions are cooler more photos of burials can be taken.
- Resources currently and continuing to be used:
  - o The Grave Diggers Record book (held by NFHS)
  - Photo Album of photos taken of headstones taken previously and compiled by Karilyn Pawley (held by NFHS)
  - o Trove to confirm some unmarked graves or burial dates.
  - o Parish Records from the Anglican Parish records Newcastle University.
  - Australian Cemetery Index confirming if a headstone still exists.

#### Recommendations:

- O Digitalise Photos from the album as there are some empty spots either not put in or have been taken out, and to preserve the photos. (perhaps another resource to sell)
- New Database and new format.

### • Future plans

- O Source the Star archives, if possible, current CHB publication has 4 graves be being dug out from the sand dunes. Only 3 of those graves are still visible, may have found the last one but not sure as no records are available to confirm.
- o Any further resources that could be of use, please let me know.
- o Still in progress.
