Treasurer's Position Vacant Following AGM

What Happens Now?

As our NFHS Constitution only permits Management Committee Members to hold the same position for a period of four consecutive terms (a term being the period between AGMs) we now find ourselves in the position of having no treasurer.

Our secretary received no nominations for the position nor did a call for nominations from the floor at the AGM result in filling the position.

As it is not possible for a society such as ours to function without a treasurer, we have taken advice as to a constitutionally acceptable way of temporarily overcoming our predicament.

Marie Hughes, our immediate past treasurer, has self-nominated for the non-elected position of Assistant Treasurer. In this capacity, Marie will ensure continuity of our financial affairs, however, she will no longer be an elected member of our management committee which leaves us one member short of the necessary seven committee members required according to our 2021 Constitution. Marie will continue to attend our management meetings as a guest but will have no voting rights.

Please be assured that the NFHS will continue to function at its usual high standard, and we will seek further advice from Fair Trading when our annual reports are submitted shortly. A copy of the relevant section of the 2021 Constitution is provided below.

15. Composition and membership of Committee

The Committee is to consist of:

President

Vice-President

Secretary

Treasurer

General Member 1

General Member 2

General Member 3

Each of whom is to be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Association under clause 15 or appointed by the Committee to a casual vacancy.

In the event of the Committee being deadlocked, the President has a casting vote.

- A Committee member must be eighteen (18) years of age or over.
- The Secretary's position can be split into two distinct roles: Secretary and Minute Secretary. The Secretary will hold voting rights on the Committee.
- The executive and elected General Committee Members have a maximum number of four (4) consecutive terms for which a Committee member may hold the same office.
- Each member of the Committee is, subject to this constitution, to hold office until immediately before the election of Committee members at the annual general meeting next following the date of the member's election, and is eligible for re-election.

Note: To be eligible for election you must be a financial member for two (2) years.

The holders of non-elected position, eg Librarian, Membership Registrar, are invited to all Committee meetings and are able to speak on their area. They do not have voting rights.

<u>President's Report for the Annual General Meeting</u> <u>Tuesday 7 May 2024 at 7.30pm</u>

As I report to you this year I do so with a much more positive outlook for the Newcastle Family History Society.

The past few years have had their challenges. Our Society, like so many other Family History Societies, has felt the negative impact of diminishing numbers of members and visitors, rising overheads, and the aftermath of Covid which has brought considerable change. It has also brought a great deal of uncertainty.

These years have taught us that it is essential to adapt the way we function so that we embrace change in a positive manner to better serve the needs of our members and the community. The NFHS is always keen to espouse new things which will help us move forward.

We do not have to look far to find innovative ways in which our Society excels. Our initiative to offer hybrid monthly meetings together with recorded presentations on our YouTube Channel provides excellent opportunities for members to access our wonderful guest speakers. Our new podcasting initiative also provides a new and exciting way to share information and expertise with our members and the family history community in general.

We have a lot of followers from other Societies, and even from overseas! We showcase Newcastle as a society of excellence.

Our NFHS website keeps everyone abreast of our activities and provides our members with up-to-date reports on our Management Committee Meetings, our financial activities, membership, correspondence, and quarterly reports from each of our groups. Our many exchange journals are now also available to read at home via the Members' Area of the website. We now also have a second website entitled *Female Convicts of the Hunter Valley* which provides information about this important part of our history which has been so thoroughly researched by Society members.

Our online shop now offers downloadable publications which is a giant step forward towards greater sales. Purchasers have immediate downloads with no postage costs. There is also no cost to the Society and a lot less work for our Publications Officer.

For these advances in our technology, we owe a debt of thanks to the expertise and commitment of our IT Officer and our Webmaster.

It is pleasing to note that our membership is increasing on a monthly basis, and we are finding enthusiastic new members attending our Special Interest Groups, courses, and excursions. We are also finding a return to busy Thursday afternoons at the Society. Our increased membership is often a direct result of open days, tours or courses which have been run at or by the Society where visitors have recognised how we can help them with their family history pursuits.

I want to extend a sincere thank you to all the groups who work so hard to keep our society functioning at such a high level. The eTeam, the Library Group, Snippers, Publications, the Sandgate Group, and the Research Group, all contribute to our family history knowledge. Special Interest Groups bring us together and create a sense of community around our shared love of family history. A huge thank you to the library volunteers who give their time so freely. I also want to acknowledge those who handle the technology, communications, and financial matters - your contributions are essential in keeping the society running efficiently. I am incredibly grateful to all those who contribute so much of their time to making our society run so smoothly.

I would also like to express my heartfelt thanks to the outgoing Management Committee members who have always worked together in a collegial manner to ensure that our Society functions at its optimum at all times. Our incoming Committee, to be elected shortly, will continue to ensure that the NFHS operates at its best throughout the remainder of this year and well into 2025 with a team of committed members leading the way.






Recent Book Launch
