The end of passwords?

With the rise of passcodes, we're finally <u>saying goodbye to complex</u>, <u>hard-to-remember password</u>s—or are we? Are you like me and find yourself sifting through password managers, scribbled notes, or even that secret spreadsheet where you've stashed endless logins?

Now, passcodes aim to simplify things, but the question remains: are they actually easier to remember? For many of us, adapting to a new system of security codes, especially across multiple accounts, means our trusty storage methods are far from obsolete.

New Records

In October, FamilySearch added millions of new records to its free online archives, including:

- Over 2 million census records from Luxembourg
- 895,000 census and civil registrations from the Philippines
- 242,000 church records from Russia
- 300,000 civil registrations from Hungary
- 134,000 cemetery records from Chile
- 236,000 parish and civil registrations from France
- Over 2 million census records from Luxembourg.

Sorting DNA Matches in Ancestry

Ancestry's latest update to ProTools brings a highly anticipated feature —sorting DNA matches! You can now reorder your shared matches based on their shared cM with each other, not just your own shared cM with each match. This gives you a clearer view of connections within your matches.
