Message from the President



Welcome to this edition of our Newsletter.

The Australian Tax Office has changed rules for not-for-profit organisations, which will affect many of our societies. Many groups have contacted the committee for more information. So, as a result, a special Zoom

meeting for secretaries and treasurers and anyone else interested was held. Now is the time for all societies to do their self-assessments for the past tax year.

Museums of History NSW, previously known as NSW State Archives, put a call out for assistance from Societies to assist with scanning and transcribing the records of the Small Debt Books. There are over 300 books for the state, discussions were held with Martyn Killion via Zoom before several societies put

our hands up to assist with this, covering about half the collection, but it is hoped that societies might do other books so that the collection can be completed. My Society has completed the Picton Books. I found several of my own ancestors while transcribing the books, who knew that my great uncle leased land for his animals beside what he owned.

Sadly, my mother, Helen, died in October 2023 just 4 short months after my father, which was a shock to all. After cleaning out their house of 55 years, much of their belongings ended up at my place to decide what was needed and what was not. I am amazed as to my findings, she wrote her story, her first day at boarding school where she ended up being a godmother to a baby baptised that day, followed by the reasons her family moved to this area, another story, why her grandmother moved from Victoria to New South Wales, where she met her husband to be. This is just my family, the work she did for our local society was amazing and Kate, our librarian, is starting to dread me going into the rooms as I bring more information to be filed. Not to forget her book collection, many I already have, she loved a good bargain and came home from many conferences with new or old books.

The Association sits on the AFFHO Committee. Their tri-annual conference will be held in Brisbane in March 2025. Called Australasian Conference Connections 2025 – PAST – PRESENT – FUTURE. More information is available on their website and below in this newsletter.
