It is the Group's policy that we do not commence research until the applicable fee is received. Only a search of the resources held by the Young & District Family History Group Inc. will be undertaken.

COST: An initial **\$10.00** non-refundable search fee is required with your FIRST enquiry before any investigation will be conducted.

COST: A further **\$40.00** research fee per family name (e.g.: Mr & Mrs Smith and children, "Smith" being the family name) is required should the initial request uncover a considerable amount of information, or the request is complex.

MEETINGS: Meetings and special events will be advised by email to all financial members.

GENERAL: Members requesting information from the Group's Library are reminded that the Research Monitors work on a voluntary basis and can only provide information from the resources available.

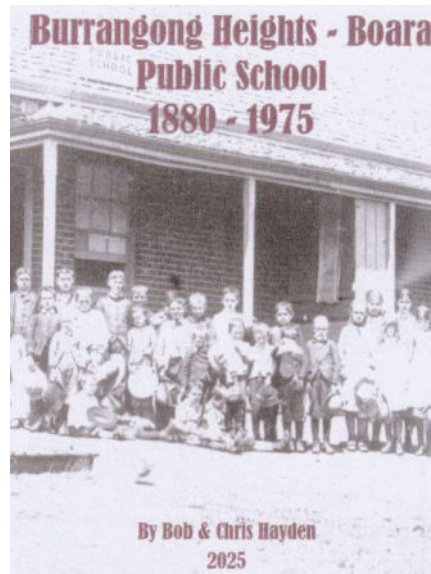

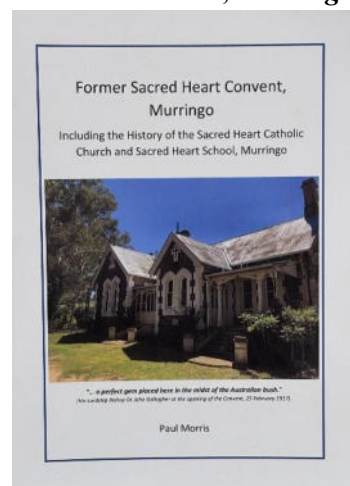
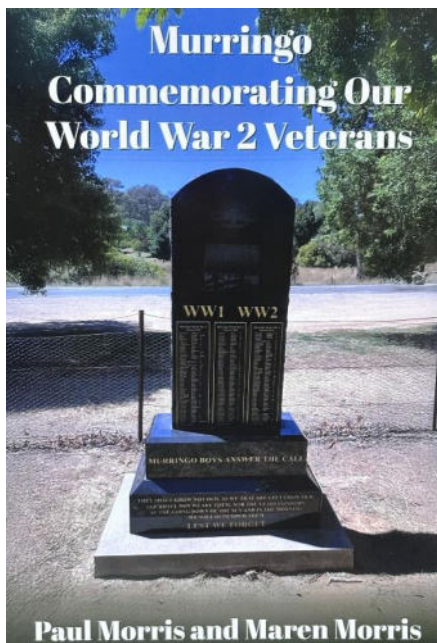

Andrew Redfern's Seminar



Saturday 1st March 2025 saw Andrew visit us at Young for a one-day seminar. This was held at the Young Services Club, which received many favorable reviews as a venue.

Andrew grew up in Wellington NSW and has been interested in family history since school in the 1980's. He has a collection of "interesting" ancestors including murderers, asylum inmates, wealthy gentleman and travelling musicians.

Andrew is a teacher by profession, but is now a full-time family historian, he has a background in technology and has added Artificial Intelligence to his tool kit. Andrew was headed off to do a presentation for "RootsTech" after he left us and has delivered talks across the world including the UK and USA. We had forty people attend our seminar at Young and they all enjoyed it very much.

Did you know that there is only about 20% of research digitized and put online? That leaves about 80% of research in hard copy, in research rooms like ours at Young and the many other research centers of family history groups.

What is a family historian? They are a researcher, a storyteller, and an historian.

Have you thought about writing a book about all or certain members of your family, this would bring them alive for the rest of the family.

Convicts – there is a data base called "Ironclad Sisterhood" with about 4,700 women convicts listed on it, including lots of other information.

Try and speak to some of your older relatives, they have great stories to tell and if you can record them, it would be a wonderful keepsake.

What is AI? It is auto correction in texts, google maps, "hints" on Ancestry plus lots more that is very advanced technology. Andrew gave us many examples on the day.

He also spoke about his relative Dr William Redfern, which was a very interesting story.

All in all, this was a very successful day, we have had lots of requests to have Andrew back, and we are working on this with him as we speak, so please watch this space for a date for next year.

Monday 31st March saw Young welcome the Chauvel First Light Horse Memorial Ride.

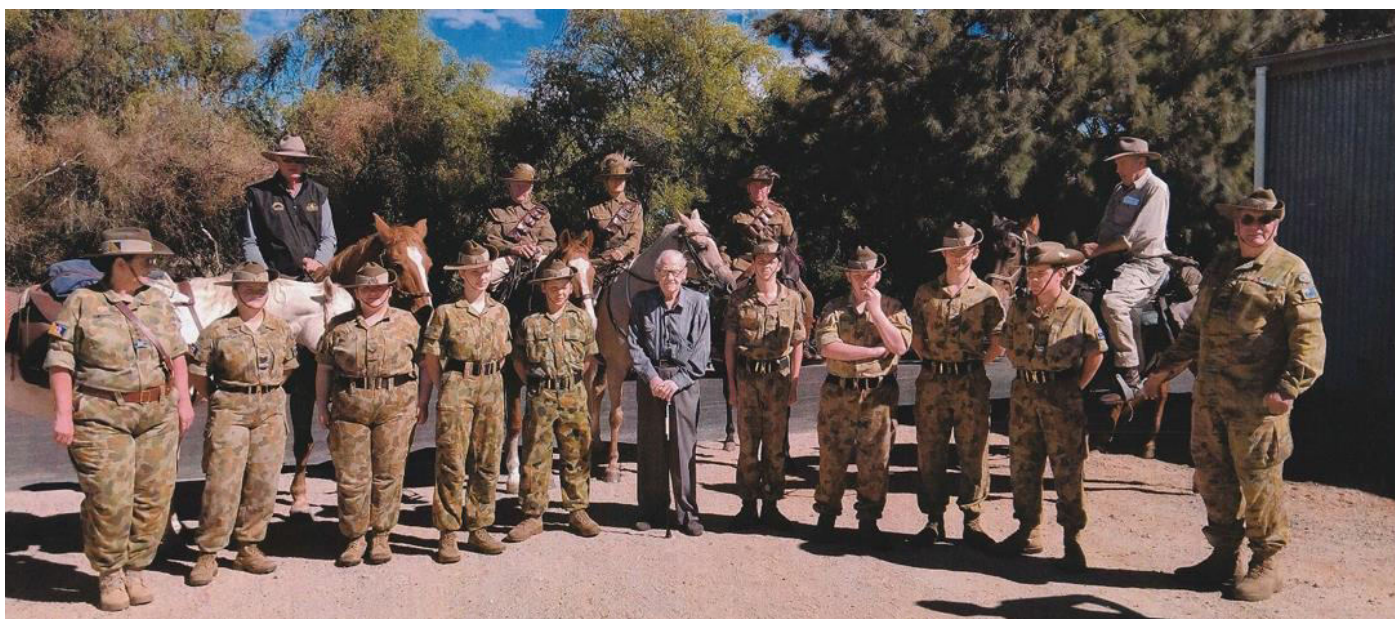
Young & District Family History Group Inc. was asked to put together a list of names of those light horsemen who joined up from Young and the surrounding villages for the First World war. This we did and supplied 67 names which were presented to the group of riders, this list will go to a memorial for the light horsemen that the riders will set up. We have a copy of this list in our research room at 2 Campbell Street if anyone would like to view it.

Mayor Brian Ingram and local MP Steph Cooke were in attendance along with about 100 people who turned up to help celebrate this monumental ride. A special guest from Young to attend was Kenneth Richard Samuel Rennie, born 21-5-1925 he joined the air force in 1944 in the airfield construction squadron and served in Borneo, he was discharged on 3-4-1936. He is pictured with our local Cadet Unit from Young who were also in attendance. Riders to attend were Mogga Morris, Des Clark, Legan Robson, Pat Leary and David Shannon.

The riders also visited Young Public School where they held a small Anzac Service and the children from Hennessy, Young High School and Young Public School all lined Campbell Street to farewell the riders as they left to ride to Wombat.

We would like to thank Phil Mitchell from the Young RSL sub-branch for MCing the event and also providing morning tea for the riders and dignitaries. Those in attendance from Young Family History were Sue Wilkes, Sue Caldwell, Kay McDonald, Margaret Hall and Emma Cockburn. We are very proud to have been asked to help with this event.

A Report from the 17th Australasian Congress



Brisbane - 21 to 24 March 2025

I was lucky to be able to attend this conference held at the end of March where I caught up with friends from my University of Tasmania family history diploma days, made new friends and listened to talks presented by some very experienced and knowledgeable people from many countries and walks of life. The hosts were the Genealogical Society of Queensland and the venue chosen was the conference centre at the Brisbane Technological Park in Eight Miles Plains. It was the 17th Australasian Congress on Genealogy and Heraldry & 5th Queensland History State Conference.



Connection 2025 delegates

The conference themes were "Diaspora (Migration), Looking Forward and Local History" and there were more than 400 delegates in attendance. It was a lively event from the Friday through to the Sunday. The featured speakers were.



Judy Russell, The Legal Genealogist®, a Colorado native and a genealogist with a law degree. She writes, teaches and lectures on a wide variety of genealogical topics, providing expert guidance through the murky territory where law and family history collide. Judy's masterclass titled, 'You be the judge – Ethics in Action' talked about the many ethical issues that can arise in family history from the long-buried family secrets to DNA disclosures.



Dr Nick Barratt is best known for his work on the TV show 'Who Do You Think You Are' and has written various history books. Nick chose 'Researching and writing your family history' as a historian, genealogist and published author he used a story from his family as a case study. He also ran a second master class on 'Researching your English ancestors prior to 1700'



Hamish Maxwell-Stewart, professor of heritage and digital humanities at the University of New England and the CEO of Digital History Tasmania.

Hamish's class 'A Guide to Digitising the Past' demonstrated the work being undertaken by Digital History Tasmania to safeguard the preservation of the World Heritage listed Tasmanian convict records. Work I am very happy to be able to participate in.

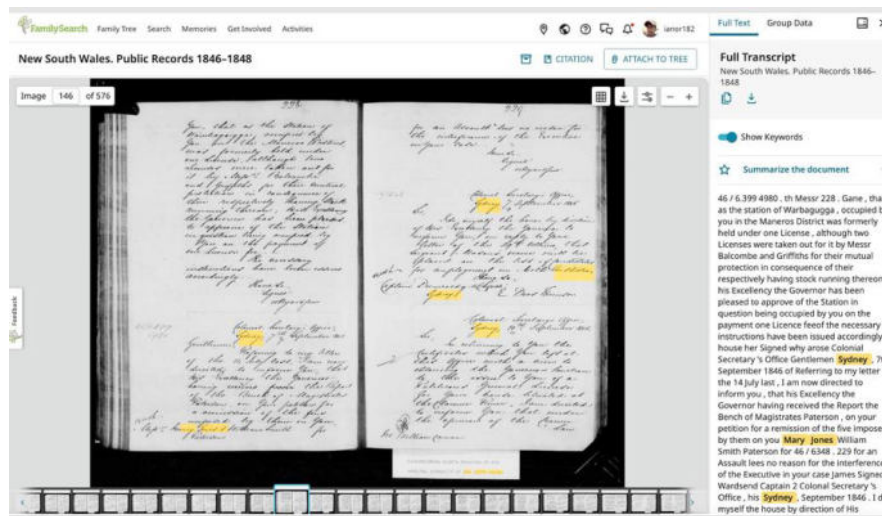

Heritage Tours | Female Orphan School

Event description

Discover the rich history of Australia's oldest three-story structure, **the Female Orphan School**.

Established in 1813 to provide shelter and care for young girls away from the hardships of Sydney Town's colony, this significant heritage site later became the Rydalmere Psychiatric Hospital before falling into disrepair. Abandoned and covered in graffiti, its future remained uncertain until extensive restoration efforts began in 2000, culminating in its full revitalisation by 2013.

Now meticulously restored, the building serves as the proud home of the Whitlam Institute. Visitors can explore its remarkable past through guided tours and visit two exceptional galleries: the **Permanent Exhibition on the Whitlam Government** and **the Margaret Whitlam Gallery**.

The Female Convicts Research Centre promotes interest in the female convicts of Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania), by encouraging and facilitating research.

From 1803 to 1853, 13,500 female convicts were transported to Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania), as punishment for crimes, mainly theft. After serving their sentences they were released into the community. Their transportation left a lasting legacy. The Female Convicts Research Centre encourages research into these female convicts, mainly through its database, website and seminars.

Registrations close on 25 April (Seminar) and 29 April (webinar). Registration is \$60 (Seminar – includes morning tea and lunch) or \$40 (Webinar).

'The first people to take up their quarters on the Lachlan field consisted of miners, storekeepers and packers from Lambing Flat, Sofala, Kiandra, and Adelong, stockmen, shepherds and generally useless station hands from up and down the river, publicans from Bathurst, Orange, and other western districts, "billiardists," "gaffers," and "rowdies" of every stamp and grade, and crowds of those particular roughs, who seen to drop from the clouds in to every new rush, and, so far as I can judge, are never seen anywhere else.'
