Overview of April meeting

Our guest speaker for the month of April was Community Historian, Lachlan Wetherall. Lachlan has written 118 short local history articles for Newcastle's monthly community newspaper, *The Local*. He bases most articles on an old photograph which he has researched, often needing to find the exact date, location or occasion of that photograph. In most instances he also provides a recent photograph giving a 'then and now' perspective. His talk, which is available on our NFHS YouTube Channel, explains the tools, techniques and resources he has used to identify this information.

After acknowledging the traditional custodians of the land, Lachlan explained that all the photographs in his presentation were, to the best of his knowledge, taken on Awabakal land. He then went on to give a brief overview of his own background as a newly retired worker in the fields of electrical engineering and information technology for the past 40 years.

Lachlan's talk is predominantly about dating and locating a photograph by examining the contents of the image. He stresses, however, that *there is no methodical step-by-step guide to success*. He then goes on to present 8 photographs, mainly by Ralph Snowball, and guides us through the process he used to date and locate each one.

Lachlan's tips for us include:

- That we must question everything as the published information provided with a photograph may not be correct.
- Find a good collaborator to work with share ideas and seek suggestions. Even if your collaborator can't offer suggestions, sometimes just trying to explain a problem to another person leads you to an insight that gets you closer to the answer.

- Compare with other photos.
- Use Google Earth Pro, which is available as a free download to install on your computer. It can provide confirmation by comparing the topography (the shape of the landscape) with the subject photo. It is particularly useful for ruling out wrong guesses.
- Look for buildings, utilities, and infrastructure that can be dated from other sources. For example, train lines, train lines, bridges, street lighting, telegraph lines, kerbing stones.
- Use old maps such as Street directories, National Library of Australia, State Library of NSW, Newcastle University Living Histories in particular for the Newcastle area they have a collection of 1890s Water Board maps to help you.
- Locating → Dating, Dating → Locating.
- For dating photographs, searching for newspaper reports in Trove is invaluable.
- Sometimes Land Titles can help, by identifying when and where certain individuals owned land. The historical land records viewer (HLRV) can assist with this for records earlier than about 1960.
- Aerial photos can be useful. The NSW Historical Aerial Imagery website which has imagery from 1943 to 2001, and Google Earth Pro
 that has historical aerial imagery from about 2005 onwards.
- The Guess and Test Method make an educated *guess*, then *test* if that guess matches the photo. Like a cryptic crossword sometimes instead of using the clue to work out the answer, you have to guess an answer and test if it matches the clue.
- Paying attention to advertising and signage such as shop signs, advertising, and road signs can help to date a photograph.
- Details on the front of negative boxes. This tip is particular to Ralph Snowball photos, as he stored his glass plate negatives in wooden boxes. Each box had a paper label with a short description of contents. Newcastle University Special Collections have scanned these listings and made them available online.
- Are there any unusual details in the photograph which might help you?

Lachlan's presentation provides us with the type of guidance needed to help us make informed decisions about the location and date of photographs we may be seeking to identify. To benefit fully from Lachlan's expertise, it is necessary to view the recording via the link provided above. I am sure you will get as much out of it as I did! Thanks so much to Lachlan for taking the time to provide us with this interesting, informative and educational presentation.

Lockers

There are eight lockers to store your personal belongings while you are volunteering. They are in the hallway between the Reception Room and the Blue Room. The locker keys are kept in the second drawer of the reception desk on a small set of hooks. Please return the key before you go home.

Photocopying

NFHS has a printer in the blue room that prints from the blue room computers. WHEREVER POSSIBLE COPIES FROM ANY NFHS PUBLICATION SHOULD BE MADE BY PUTTING THE CD OR USB INTO A BLUE ROOM COMPUTER AND PRINTING THE PAGE FROM THERE. There is a photocopier/scanner next to the catalogue computer in the reception area. The directions for using this scanner/printer are on the noticeboard behind the scanner. The directions are on the front and back of the sheet so it is therefore pinned only on one edge.

Members and guests are asked to pay 30c for each printout, scan or photocopy. Payment is usually made into the white moneyboxes near the copier in the blue room and reception room but payment by credit card is possible.

NOTE: NFHS also has two photocopiers in the meeting room. These copiers are used to produce material for the Library and generally should not be used for any other photocopying.

Cemetery Researchers— Important Information

Major Changes to Cemetery Deceased Searches

Deceased Searches for Sandgate and some other cemeteries have changed. The old Northern Cemeteries facility no longer exists and we need to use Metropolitan Memorial Parks' (MMP) Find a Loved One (FALO). With this change has come major changes to the information available:

- No more photos can be viewed on the site (due to privacy concerns)
- 'First name' is a required field in the search information

Look at https://www.metropolitanmemorialparks.com.au/find-a-loved-one to see how it works. Click 'Find a Loved One', at top right. Use the drop-down 'Memorial Park' box to select Sandgate.

You will see full name, date of interment, location. Click on 'Details >'.

Then you'll see the same information plus 'Coordinates', like this:

Full Name: Axxx Byyy Czzz (as in their records)

Date of Interment: --/--- (as in their records)

Memorial park: Sandgate Cemetery

Location: ANGLICAN No. X, YYY, ANGLICAN No. X-YYY-ZZ (i.e. Area, row, grave

number)

Coordinates: Click to get directions

'Click to get directions' gives GPS coordinates and a map showing where the grave is located.

If you are concerned about these changes and the reasons for them, send your concerns to Diana Kahui (MMP's Head of Experience and Engagement) at diana.kahui@mmplm.com.au, providing specific examples of how they affect your research if you can.

Sandgate Group members have met with MMP and discussed these changes. We've sent a submission voicing concern about the loss of photos which means researchers or family members at a distance from Sandgate cannot see a headstone and the information on it. We've asked that the first name not be 'required', to allow a family name search and because the first name may not be known and it is often not the name that people are known by. We've asked for these concerns to be forwarded to the authorities who could reassess the privacy conditions.

We have also asked our Society Management Committee to look at the website and communicate concerns with MMP as well.

N.B.: Changes apply to ALL cemeteries run by MMP: Rookwood General, Macquarie Park, Frenchs Forest Bushland, Gore Hill Memorial, Woronora Memorial, Eastern Suburbs Memorial, Field of Mars, and Sandgate cemeteries.


